

# Technology Resources for Parents

The goal of this guide is to provide resources for parents regarding technology usage and Internet safety. We want to help you find the tools, filters, and resources you need to protect your family. These resources are only a tool; not a substitute for ongoing conversations with your kids and their doctors, teachers, and other experts. Navigating technology usage with children is a complex issue and these resources are not exhaustive, but may be helpful to get you started.

"Our tendency is to jump to restrictions as the first line of defense. Restrictions are helpful in that they give kids a clear sense of what we expect from them. But sometimes kids encounter things online that they did not expect.

In addition to open and honest conversations, it is important that we walk kids through what to do in unwanted and unsafe situations.

When parents and kids make a habit of sharing what we're seeing and experiencing online, for safety's sake, we improve our communication and interaction with one another."

Focus on the heart regarding appropriate technology use and responsibility. Talk about principles like respect, boundaries, kindness and integrity. Evaluate your own technology usage and look for ways to train kids to make wise choices. Share your process in deciding what to post, when to use your phone, etc. Talk about how your kids should respond if they see something inappropriate online and allow your child to gradually mature into technology usage.

# Protect your Home WiFi

As you consider the tools that will be helpful to your family, filtering your home WiFi at the router level is an important first step. If your Internet router is filtered, all devices that use your home WiFi will be filtered as well. Note that these devices will only be filtered AT HOME and not when using other WiFi networks. Devices connecting to the Internet via cellular data will not be filtered.

#### Set Up Parental Controls on all devices that access the Internet

Make a list of all devices your family owns that can access the Internet. Note who uses them and where (at home, at school, at a friend's house, etc.) Many of these devices will be protected by your router filter at home, but may need additional content filters for when they are used on an unfiltered wireless network.
