As the disciples are sent into the world by Jesus to serve his purposes, so are we.

1. Read Mark 3:13-15. Discuss what you think the phrase “that they might be with him...” is all about. What does being called to be with Jesus look like in our lives? Why is this so important?
2. Read I Corinthians 3:5-9. Discuss what you think it means to “plant” and “water” in the context in which Paul uses these terms.
3. Read John 16:7-11. What does Jesus reveal about the Holy Spirit’s role in a person coming to Christ for salvation?
4. Look at II Corinthians 5:14-21. Can each of us explain clearly what the “message of reconciliation” is in our own words”? What equipping do we need at CFC to feel comfortable sharing the Gospel and our own testimony of what Jesus Christ has done in our lives?
5. Read Mark 6:7, 12-13. What might it look like to confront demonic spiritual forces of darkness?

Application

Would each of us begin to pray for at least one person, that the Father would be drawing them to Jesus, and for opportunities for us to be used by him in their lives? Let’s be accountable to each other in this mission field.

Theme- As the disciples are sent into the world by Jesus to serve his purposes, so are we.

Intro- Mark 6-29

Point 1-

At the very beginning of his ministry Jesus sows the vision for his followers being his witnesses, the "Sent Ones". (Mark 1:14-18)

Point 2-

Before ever being sent we are first called to be "with him". (Mark 3:13-15)

Point 3-

We are sent into a lost world with a powerful, life-changing message. (II Corinthians 5:14-21)

Point 4-

We are co-laborers with Christ on a mission to rescue souls from the dominion of darkness. (Luke 9:1-2)

Point 5-

We need to be filled with and led by the Holy Spirit of God. (John 6:44)

Point 6-

We need to let God do what only God can do. (John 16:7-11) (Acts 16:13-15)

Point 7-

We need to pray and ask God to fill our hearts with his love for people and for opportunities to be his witnesses to world around us.
