Jonah 1:17

Now the Lord provided a huge fish to swallow Jonah, and Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

Jonah 2:1-2

From inside the fish Jonah prayed to the Lord his God.
He said:

"In my distress **I called** to the Lord,
and he answered me.
From deep in the realm of the dead **I called** for help,
and you listened to my cry.

Jonah 2:3

³**You** hurled me into the depths,
into the very heart of the seas,
and the currents swirled about me;
all **your** waves and breakers
swept over me.

Jonah 2:4-6

I said, 'I have been banished
from your sight;
yet I will look again
toward your holy temple.'

The engulfing waters threatened me,
the deep surrounded me;
seaweed was wrapped around my head.
To the roots of the mountains I sank down;
the earth beneath barred me in forever."

**But you, Lord my God,

When my life was ebbing away,
