Irresistible John 17:20-26

²⁰ "I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, ²¹ that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me.²² The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, ²³ I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me. ²⁴ Father, I desire that they also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory that you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world. ²⁵ O righteous Father, even though the world does not know you, I know you, and these know that you have sent me. ²⁶ I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them."

1. Read John 17:20-26. What is it about the glory of God that is so irresistible? Discuss the concept of selfless love from this passage.
2. What is oneness? How does oneness with God help us to become one with others? How does it change our perspective of others? What does Jesus tell us about oneness with God?
3. Our oneness is for the world to be able to see the glory of God. (v.22-23). Is that reflected in how we relate to others?
4. Read v. 24-26 again. Notice how the love of God includes the cross. How does the selfless love of God differ from the way the world defines love?
What did the cross accomplish?
What do the "crosses we bear" accomplish?
