

# Clash of Kingdoms Matthew 24:32-51 Study Guide

#### Big Idea: Be ready, faithful and wise.

1. Read Matthew 24:32-35. What signs are we seeing that indicate the end could be near? What does it mean for you and I to "learn the lesson of the fig tree"?

2. Read Matthew 24:36. Why do you think God gives us a general idea of the signs of His coming, but not the exact day or hour?

3. Read Matthew 24:37-44. What was it like in the days of Noah (see also Gen. 6:5&11). What is the lesson for us? What does it mean to be "ready" for His return?

4. Read Matthew 24:45-51. Discuss:

a. Ready- Am I ready for the return of Christ? Is there something God may want me to do to prepare for His eternal Kingdom?

b. Faithful- Am I using my time and resources for God's will or my will? How can I be a faithful steward? c. Wise- Am I being a wise servant? Am I getting too comfortable? What influences do I surround myself with? How can I develop more self-control?

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## A. The Lesson of the Fig Tree (v.32-35)

<sup>22</sup> "From the <u>fig tree</u> learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts out its <u>leaves</u>, you know that summer is near. <sup>33</sup>So also, when you <u>see all these things</u>, you know that he is <u>near</u>, <u>at the very</u> <u>gates</u>. <sup>34</sup>Truly, I say to you, this generation <u>will not pass away</u> until all these things take place. <sup>35</sup>Heaven and earth will pass away, but my <u>words will not pass</u> away.

Genesis 6:5- "The Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually."

#### 2 Tim. 3:1-4

"But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. <sup>2</sup>For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, <sup>3</sup>heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good, <sup>4</sup>treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God."

<sup>45</sup> "Who then is the faithful and wise servant, whom his master has set over his household, to give them their food at the proper time?<sup>46</sup> Blessed is that servant whom his master will find so doing when he comes. <sup>47</sup> Truly, I say to you, he will set him over all his possessions.

<sup>48</sup>But if that wicked servant says to himself, 'My master is delayed,'<sup>49</sup>and begins to <u>beat his fellow servants</u> and eats and drinks with drunkards, <sup>50</sup>the master of that servant will come on a day when he does not expect him and at an hour he does not know <sup>51</sup>and will cut him in pieces and put him with the hypocrites. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.
