- 3. Paul talks about being "justified by faith in Christ." What does this mean to you, and how does it impact your understanding of your own identity?
- 4. How does the image of being in a grand courtroom of divine justice change your perspective on your own righteousness and identity?
- 5. The sermon discusses the idea of being "in Christ" and clothed in His righteousness. How does this concept resonate with you personally?
- 6. Why do you think Paul called out Peter for separating himself from Gentiles in the mixed gathering? How does this relate to the theme of a fresh identity in Christ?
- 7. We emphasize oneness in Christ and the idea that there are no outsiders in the family of Jesus. How does this idea challenge or change the way you view fellowship with other Christians?
- 8. How do you personally experience God's love and satisfaction in your life, especially during times of fragility or restlessness?
