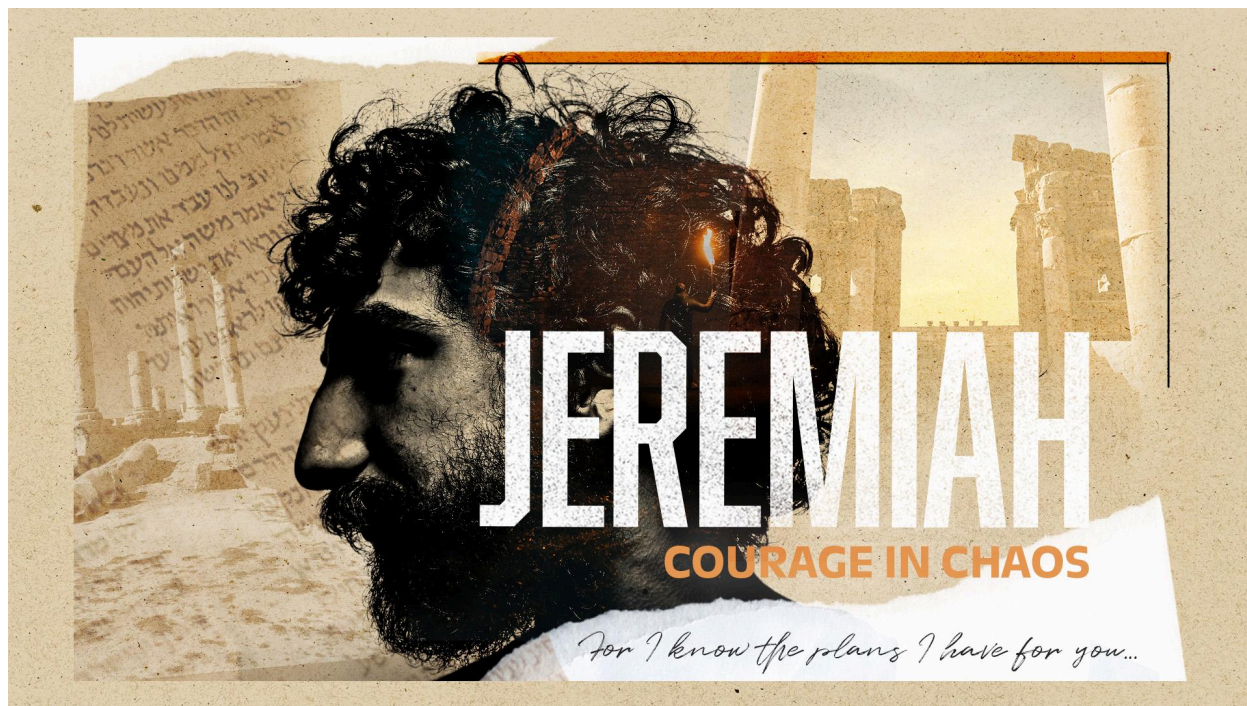


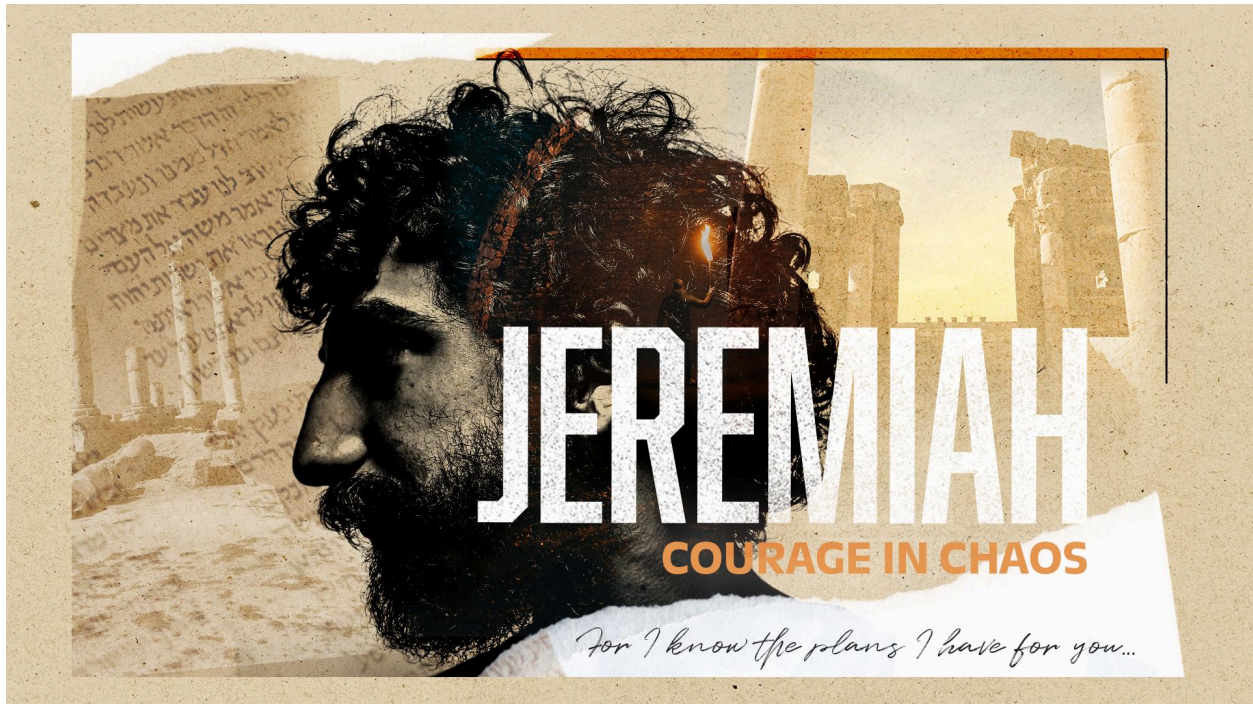
Jeremiah 26-29

Sermon Notes

He does KNOW the plans HE has for you...

- I. Jeremiah in the Temple (26)
 - “God is Hopeful” – that I may relent
 - a. Jeremiah preaches (1-6)
 - b. Jeremiah is threatened with death (7-11)
 - c. Jeremiah defends himself (12-15)
 - d. Jeremiah is spared (16-24)

- II. “You have got to be kidding me?!” (27)
 - “God is Sovereign”
 - a. “Put yourself under the yoke of Babylon. Serve him and his people and live”
 - i. It is important to note. God’s sovereignty here.
 - ii. This was His way of disciplining and correcting, not destroying.
 - b. Problem is Zedekiah had a host of prophets and priests telling him not to listen.

- III. Hananiah brings false prophecy (28)
God is Serious. “
 - a. Hananiah pays the ultimate price because he “preached rebellion against the Lord.”

He does KNOW the plans HE has for you. AND THEY ARE GOOD!

- IV. Thrive through it (29)
 - a. We can thrive in exile.
 - b. We can thrive wherever we are.
 - c. We can thrive because of the future hope.
