Endure to the End: 2 Timothy 2:3-7

"God Almighty has set before me two great objects, the suppression of the slave trade and the reformation of manners."

– William Wilberforce

2 Timothy 2:3-7 (ESV)

3 Share in suffering as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. 4 No soldier gets entangled in civilian pursuits, since his aim is to please the one who enlisted him. 5 An athlete is not crowned unless he competes according to the rules. 6 It is the hard-working farmer who ought to have the first share of the crops. 7 Think over what I say, for the Lord will give you understanding in everything.

Soldier - Be Focused

• Stay focused on God's mission, avoid distractions.

Athlete - Do It God's Way

Follow God's way of doing things to finish well.

Farmer - Work Hard

• Persistence and hard work are necessary for the harvest.

Two Ways to Quit:

1. Formally

Giving up completely.

2. Quiet Quitting

Losing heart, but not making an outward exit.

Big Idea: Endure to the End

Methods of Encouragement:

1. Tool (v8-9)

8 Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, the offspring of David, as preached in my gospel, 9 for which I am suffering, bound with chains as a criminal. But the word of God is not bound!

2. Template (v10)

10 Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they also may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus with eternal glory.

3. Timeless Truth (v11-13)

11 The saying is trustworthy, for:

If we have died with him, we will also live with him;

12 if we endure, we will also reign with him;

if we deny him, he also will deny us;

13 if we are faithless, he remains faithful—

for he cannot deny himself.

Application:

- 1. View Your Assignment Rightly
 - o Choose **surrender** to God's will. Trust His plan.
- 2. **Be Encouraged**
 - Remember the bigger picture and God's eternal promises.
- 3. Encourage Each Other
 - Support and uplift fellow believers in the journey.

- 2. What examples have you seen of someone "quiet quitting" on following Christ, either in your own life or others'?
 - Consider situations where someone may have stopped fully committing, even if they didn't leave the faith outright.
- 3. How might your mindset of what it means to follow Christ need to shift?
 - Think about how your understanding of following Jesus could change to help you endure, especially through tough times.
- 4. What does it mean for God to be faithful to faithless people?
 - Reflect on the amazing truth that God remains faithful, even when we are unfaithful.
- 5. How could you encourage someone to endure in their assignment this week?
 - Consider practical ways you can come alongside someone and provide encouragement to help them in their faith journey.
