Pray Love Serve Study Guide

After an appropriate time and opening in prayer, start by asking a few questions.

- 1. What jumped out to your attention from the message or what did God speak to you this weekend?
- 2. Read 1 Peter 4:7-11.
- 3. Verse 7 begins with the "end of all things are at hand." What are your understandings of being in the end times? Do you struggle with the concept?
- 4. Looking at verse 7, what does it look like in your life to live self controlled and sober minded?
- 5. In what ways does this text encourage you to pray?
- 6. Looking at verses 8-9, how have you seen love cover a multitude of sins? What areas in your life do you need God's help to change your affection/feeling of love towards someone?
- 7. Looking at verses 10-11, what gifts have you been given? How can you use them to serve others?
